

This weeks theme is English Martyrs.

This week's theme is English Martyrs. A martyr is a person who is killed because of their religious or other beliefs. This week we will look at both scripture and learn about two people Maximilian Kolbe and Oscar Romero who were both martyrs and were made saints.



St Maximilian Kolbe

St Maximilian Kolbe is one of the modern martyrs of the 20th century. When he was a young boy, he was quite naughty and one night he had a dream. He dreamt that Mary appeared to him holding two crowns, one white and one red. She asked him to choose one and he chose both. The white represented purity and he eventually became a priest. The red represented martyrdom. He died in Auschwitz as prisoner when he offered his own life to save a fellow prisoner, who did not want to die. The other prisoner eventually returned home to his family.

Kolbe was canonised (made a saint) by Pope John Paul II in 1982. Pope John Paul II decided that Kolbe should be recognised as a martyr because the systematic hatred of the Nazi regime was an act of hatred against religious faith, meaning Kolbe's death equated to martyrdom. At his canonisation, in 1982 Pope John Paul II said:

"Maximilian did not die but gave his life ... for his brother."


Opening Prayer

St Oscar Romero

Oscar Romero was a priest in El Salvador. He openly spoke out about how the government mistreated the people and how the military felt that they were above the law. Romero became a source of strength and hope for the poor and the oppressed. He worked with and for them, taking their struggles as his own. Despite threat and danger from those who opposed his ideas, Romero would write or speak passionately and publicly of the need for Christians to work for justice.

Oscar Romero was celebrating Mass when he was shot dead at the altar. He was killed for his beliefs. He was made a saint on October 14th 2018.
