The feast of the Ascension in the Catholic church is designated as a holy day of obligation. This marks a feast of great importance within the Catholic Church. Ascension takes place 40 days after Easter Sunday and commemorates the day on which the resurrected Jesus leaves his disciples in Galilee to join God the Father in heaven. Before he did so, Jesus shared with his disciples his final instruction – known as the Great Commission – to go out and deliver the message of God's love and mercy with everyone, everywhere. This is the mission all Christ's followers continue to share, and which this liturgical prayer encourages pupils to fulfil.

On Thursday we will take part in a celebration of the Word and celebrate Ascension Thursday.

### Ascension Thursday

### 9<sup>th</sup> May 2024



We gather as a school family to celebrate the Ascension of Jesus.

Ascension means 'going up' and today we remember how, forty days after his resurrection, Jesus returned to heaven.

In the Catholic faith, Ascension traditionally falls 40 days after Easter, which is a Thursday. It is a holy day of obligation. On Ascension Thursday Jesus ascended into heaven.

When Jesus ascended into heaven, he told the apostles to wait on the Holy Spirit to come upon them. They stayed and prayed for 9 days until Pentecost Sunday, making the first novena.

A novena is a prayer prayed for 9 days and the concept is based on this event.

The ascension of Jesus is the 2nd glorious mystery of the rosary!

Word: Luke ends his gospel with this story of Jesus' ascension.

#### A reading from the Gospel of Luke Glory to you O Lord

Jesus said to his disciples: "This is what is written: the Messiah must suffer and must rise from death three days later, and in his name the message about repentance and the forgiveness of sins must be preached to all nations, beginning gin Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And I myself will send upon you what my Father has promised. But you must wait in the city until the power from above comes down upon you."

Then he led them out of the city, as far as Bethany, where he raised his hands and blessed them. As he was blessing them, he departed from them and was taken into heaven. They worshipped him and went back into Jerusalem, filled with great joy, and spent all their time in the Temple giving thanks to God.

The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ. Today, as we reflect on the story of Jesus returning to his Father, we remember also his promise to be with us always. Though he is no longer visible on earth, he is still present with us.

Jesus reminds his friends that they are to be witnesses, to tell the world about him. He promises that he will send a power from above, the Holy Spirit, to help them to do this.

Jesus entrusts his mission of love to the disciples. He entrusts his mission of love to each of us.

Jesus' ascension means we must now be the hands and feet and voice of Jesus in the world. We need to go out and be disciples of Christ.

As St Teresa of Avila wrote:

Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands trough which he blesses all the world.

Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, You are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours.



Let us pray:

Jesus, you are with us always. Help us to recognise your presence in all our brothers and sisters around the world.

May we share your love with all people.

Jesus, you bring us good news. We pray for all who share your message of peace. May we share your love with all people.

Jesus, you are risen from the dead. May we celebrate the joy of the resurrection, May we share your love with all people.

Jesus, you ascended into heaven. Help us keep our eyes fixed on you. May we share your love with all people.

Jesus, you promised the Holy Spirit to us. Make us witnesses to you in our everyday life. *May we share your love with all people*.
