#### Headteacher's Award



#### Respect

This week we have asked our students to focus on how they respect themselves and others. In the words of Maya Angelou, "**Do the best you can until you know better. #### Uniform

A huge thank you to parents/carers for supporting us in ensuring that our students are wearing their uniform with pride, showing that they belong.

We want our students to focus on cultivating their character and learning rather than on differentiating themselves through dress. We don't want any students to feel left out because they cannot afford certain items of jewellery, etc. Some rules also have a health and safety focus. Our clear rules discussions avoid sensitive over what is acceptable. Our uniform encourages high aspirations.



#### Safeguarding Update: 'On Call' Escort

We have introduced a new system to safeguard our students further. During lesson time, if a student needs to leave the classroom for a particular reason (e.g. medical need, appointment, intervention) the teacher in the classroom will press an alert button on Arbor (our management information system). This alerts the member of staff that is 'on call' / 'on tour' who will collect them and escort them to where they need to be. Students are not permitted to leave the classroom during lesson time without adult supervision.

During lesson changeover and at break/lunch, staff continue to flood the corridors to supervise and students are encouraged to make their way to their next lesson with pace and purpose.

Our staff must be able to come to work without fear of violence, abuse or harassment. Please treat our people with respect. Shouting, swearing and aggressive behaviour towards our staff will not be tolerated and we reserve the right to ask you to leave our school site if you display such behaviour.

#### Knowledge Organisers: Cycle 2


This week, all KS3 & KS4 students have been issued with a knowledge organiser which contains the essential knowledge needed for their curriculum subjects.

At home, they can help students complete homework, revise for exams, and allow parents to track what their child is learning and how they are progressing in each subject.
