The Mathematics Department is delighted to announce a brand new partnership between St Bede's and Byron and one of the most prestigious schools in the North East, Royal Grammar School Newcastle.

As part of the first initiative within the partnership, a group of Year 10 pupils shall have the opportunity to complete the GCSE Further Mathematics qualification through weekly virtual lessons, completing their examinations in June 2026. This exciting expansion to our curriculum not only provides St Bede's pupils with an additional qualification (with an impressive track record of exceptional results), but will also strengthen their understanding and confidence, bolstering their GCSE Mathematics capability and helping to ease a future step to A Level Mathematics.

In the future, we plan to introduce more initiatives, in additional to this GCSE Further Mathematics provision, to further leverage our partnership with RGS to further support and benefit pupils at St Bede's and Byron.


Also, a quick reminder below:

<u>Technology and mobile phones in the Exams (guidance from the exam boards)</u>



The **minimum** penalties are as follows:

- Device found on you and turned ON disqualification for the entire subject award.
- Device found on you and turned OFF disqualification from the <u>specific paper</u> you are sitting at the time.
- Phone rings during the exam wherever it is in the room the exam board must be informed
 and you will be <u>disqualified from all papers for the subject, including any already taken</u>.
- · This rule is taken very seriously with no exceptions to it.






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Safer Internet Day: Tuesday 11 February 2025

Safer Internet Day is the UK's biggest celebration of online safety. Each year Safer Internet Day covers online issue or themes that speak to the things young people are seeing and experiencing online.





All Key Stage 3 students were taught about what they can do to protect themselves from scams and fraud online. We explored what a scam is, the signs of a scam and online sextortion. If children feel concerned about any of these online threats, they should speak to a trusted member of staff who will inform our Designated Safeguarding Leads and signpost them to appropriate support.
